On behalf of the Board of Directors and the office staff I want to begin by thanking everyone for their support of the National Guard Association of Indiana. The Soldiers and Airmen of the Indiana National Guard continue to complete missions all over the world, and your support of NGAI allows us to continue fighting for greater benefits back here at home.

The association is committed to serving you, your fellow service members, our retirees, and their families. Thanks to your support and the hard work of our legislative team we have had some notable legislative successes this year. As I write this letter, HB 1034 which would provide an Income Tax Ex-

emption for ALL military pay to include IDT and AT pay is expected to clear its final hurdle enroute to the governor's desk. If signed by the governor HB 1034 would go into effect this year. Other bills that gained traction this year were; HB1056 which would provide Hoosier Veterans with access to our States Veteran' Cemeteries; HB1511 which would protect funds allocated to the National Guard tuition supplement program from any use not related to stated purpose of the program; and HB1555 which would provide that a military service applicant who has held an occupational license, certification, registration, or permit (license) in another jurisdiction for at least one year may qualify for an Indiana license.

I also want to thank our corporate partners. Your continued support of NGAI is truly appreciated and is a big reason that we can fulfill our mission of promoting the growth and development of the Indiana Army and Air National Guard.

As many of you know Indiana will be hosting the National Guard Association of the United States annual conference in August of 2026. National Guard Soldiers from 17 states joined the Indiana National Guard's marathon team for the Indianapolis Monumental Marathon Saturday.

This race has grown into one the 15th largest marathons in the nation attracting more than 15,000 athletes.

"I'm excited to see our teammates and catch up with them, but I'm mostly excited to show off our wonderful city," said 1st Lt. Blaine Zimmerman, from Indianapolis. "Many of the folks coming in have never been to Indianapolis, so this is our opportunity to show them all our city has to offer."

The Monumental Marathon is the known as a great fall marathon for first-time marathon runners to elite athletes. Starting and finishing at the Indiana Statehouse, the course highlights landmarks, and historical neighborhoods throughout the Circle City. "I was running marathons on my own when I found out the team existed," said Zimmerman. "It seemed like a great way to participate in a unique opportunity, I never thought the Army would pay me to travel the country to run marathons, and it's been an amazing experience."

Running a marathon competitively takes hard work and dedication that can take anywhere from 12 to 16 weeks of training at minimum. The team shows what soldiers can do beyond just military service," said Sgt. Maj. Joe McFarren, from Liberty Center. "It takes a lot of dedication and discipline to compete, and this team helps keep your mind and body focused." These soldiers are running for a purpose as they compete, if their times meet the mark they will join the all guard team in more races across the country

We have exceptional athletes throughout the Indiana National Guard, but these soldiers take athletic pursuits to another level," said Brig. Gen. Justin Mann, Indiana National Guard director of joint staff. "I admire the hard work, dedication, and abilities of these men and women who represent our state in competitions like this. State Partnership Exchange At Camp Atterbury

CAMP ATTERBURY, Ind.—Three medical professionals from the Niger Armed Forces joined Indiana Army and Air National Guard medical professionals at Camp Atterbury during a state partnership exchange in July.

The weeklong training focused on public health, mental health, basic sanitary needs, and additional topics that increase the overall health of any army.

"This visit has been very beneficial," said Doctor Colonel Major Garba Hakimi, Director of army health services and social action. "It has given us an opportunity to share experiences and learn things that we can take back to our army, more specifically in the way we organize a patient during ground transportation."

Hakimi also said that observing the international teams during patient transport training, we conducted allowed him to gain valuable information to take back to their force and implement it with their trainers.

The mutually beneficial exchange took extensive international time, coordination, and planning to coordinate appropriate and applicable training.

"During my public health brief, it was evident that there are some very real and direct impacts from the work done here," said Indiana Air National Guard Lt. Col. John Shepherd state public health officer from the 181 Intelligence Wing "During the brief it was clear that they were receiving the information and actively identifying how they could implement some of the topics to their developing doctrine." Niger leaders said their army is projected to more than double in size relatively quickly making public health a hot topic. Another topic heavily focused on during this exchange was mental health and resiliency training.

Hakimi found mental health and resilience training particularly interesting.

"These topics aren't very developed in our army," said Hakimi. "Resilience training is a something we would like to further develop in our army, they gave us good information to do just that."



This exchange would not have been possible without one specifically dedicated member who had the privilege of feeling a little closer to home during her mission.


"Overall, I'm very thankful for the experience supporting this mission," said Sgt. Desiree Demercedes the exchange translator and member of the38th Sustainment Brigade. "It's not very often I get to engage in my native language, and it made me feel like I was back home."

Demercede was born and raised in Switzerland until she was a teenager when her family migrated to the United States. She currently resides in Danville.

Demercade is just one example of how our diverse force of Indiana Guardsmen live, work, and serve here and around the globe. "It takes a lot of diverse talent and dedication to develop and implement an information exchange like this successful event," said Brig. Gen. Justin Mann, director of the Indiana National Guard Joint Staff. "We have the right people in the right places and will continue to work hard to develop our relationship with our Niger partners."

A safe, stable, secure, and prosperous Africa is an enduring United States' interest. The Indiana National Guard signed another State Partnership Program agreement with Niger in 2017 and has a 20-plus year partnership with Slovakia.


